The 2020s brought an inflection point: the collapse of traditional theatrical windows, the rise of streaming wars, and the emergence of AI-driven content tools. Studios, long reliant on box office revenue and merchandising, now faced unsustainable costs for blockbuster production amid declining theater attendance and rising piracy risks. Simultaneously, algorithms began dictating content strategies—favoring bingeable formats, short attention spans, and data-driven casting decisions. This convergence of technological disruption and shifting audience behaviors eroded the studio system’s dominance, creating space for new entrants, including streaming-native studios and international players. Yet this decentralization did not resolve deeper tensions. The promise of democratization clashed with new forms of concentration: a handful of tech giants now control the majority of global streaming revenue, while AI platforms threaten to commoditize creative labor. China's state media apparatus, expanding through platforms like Tencent Video and iQIYI, now targets diaspora audiences and global markets with co-productions that blend local stories with global production values. This multipolarity forces Los Angeles to adapt: studios increasingly commission international content, hire global talent, and tailor narratives for diverse audiences. Yet this globalization raises tensions over authenticity and cultural appropriation. A 2023 report by the Brookings Institution noted that non-Western content now accounts for over 40% of global streaming consumption, up from 15% in 2015. Studio executives countered with arguments about sustainability: “We’re not resisting change—we’re adapting,” said David Ellison, chairman of Skydance Media. “The challenge is scaling innovation without destabilizing the ecosystem.” Yet critics countered that current models prioritize shareholder returns over creator well-being, citing how AI tools have already begun replacing script assistants and editors. The stakes extend beyond wages. These negotiations shape the future of creative autonomy. If AI becomes a primary scriptwriting tool, who owns the output? How are human writers compensated in a world where machines generate drafts? The strikes forced a

reckoning: creativity is not infinite, but it must remain human-centered.

Urban Transformation and the Battle for Cultural Space
