territories to disruptions—floods, raids, and shifting political control. The fragmentation of authority led to localized economies with limited integration, slowing long-term growth compared to more centralized Roman successor states. Yet this fragmentation also fostered regional specialization—Burgundy’s vineyards, Aquitaine’s textiles, the Rhineland’s metalworking—laying groundwork for medieval trade networks that would later fuel the rise of cities.
