Addressing this requires inclusive curricula that honor Korea’s multilingual heritage, not just its monolithic present. Geopolitical divides further complicate learning. North Korean defectors face unique challenges: their language often exists in hybridity, blending standard Korean with colloquialisms and trauma-laden expressions not covered in formal programs. Educational initiatives must recognize this complexity, offering support beyond grammar to include cultural and psychological adaptation. Looking ahead, AI-driven language tools promise personalized, context-sensitive learning. Chatbots trained on authentic Hallyu dialogues can simulate real conversations, teaching honorifics and idioms in nuanced scenarios. Yet these technologies must avoid reinforcing stereotypes or oversimplifying cultural complexity.
