By the early 19th century, publishers like Samuel Arnold and Robert Trotter began compiling and publishing rhymes in broadsheets and chapbooks, often sanitizing content for a burgeoning middle-class youth market. Geopolitically, rising nationalism may drive a resurgence of localized rhymes as symbols of identity, even as globalization pushes toward homogenization. The tension between rootedness and mobility will shape which rhymes endure and which vanish. Demographically, as screen time increases and traditional oral transmission declines, the transmission of rhythm as lived experience diminishes. But countervailing forces—digital archiving, community-led education, and renewed academic interest—may preserve and revitalize endangered forms. The long-term implications are profound.
