In Bombay, Priya’s grandmother taught her that jasmine—though traditionally associated with purity—could mean “I miss you” when woven into a garland placed outside a jail cell. In Dublin, Siobhan discovers her great-grandmother’s journal, filled with handwritten floral codes that decode letters smuggled out of a British prison during the Irish Land War. What distinguishes **The Language of Flowers** is its deliberate entanglement with real historical currents. The film’s geopolitical subtext is unmistakable: Fatima’s use of thyme echoes the role of herbal knowledge among North African women as both medicine and resistance

during French colonial rule. In the 1930s, colonial authorities banned the cultivation of native plants in rural Morocco, forcing women to adapt their floral lexicons—replacing imported roses with locally available lavender and rosemary, turning gardens into acts of quiet insurrection. Similarly, Priya's journey mirrors the Indian subcontinent's struggle with British botanical imperialism: colonial plant collectors exploited regional flora for economic gain, severing indigenous knowledge systems. The film's depiction of jasmine fields being seized by tea plantations in Assam is not fictional hyperbole but a historically grounded allegory of ecological and cultural dispossession. Economically, the film interrogates the commodification of floral symbolism. The film's climax unfolds in a dimly lit warehouse where Velvet Petals' CEO, a former botanist turned corporate strategist, presents a holographic display of "authenticity patents," trademarking floral combinations to prevent their use in grassroots activism. This scene is a searing commentary on late-stage capitalism's appropriation of intimacy: emotion itself becomes a brand, controlled and sold by distant elites. Within the film's narrative architecture, the language of flowers functions as a narrative engine and thematic anchor.
