Within 72 hours, the images were embedded in national discourse, not as mere documentation, but as symbols of a deeper malaise. Their power derived not from sensationalism, but from their authenticity—unretouched, unscripted, imbued with the weight of physical evidence. Experts in forensic sociology and visual anthropology emphasize the photos' unique authority. Dr. Elena Marquez, a professor at the University of Southern California's Center for Media and Society, argues: "These images function as forensic witnesses. Unlike text or testimony, they bypass interpretation—they are direct, unmediated traces. But their meaning is not fixed; they
