The Department of Homeland Security's "Domestic Security Spotlight" program, active in Idaho from 2017 to 2023, used crime documents to flag "high-risk" individuals—often based on tenuous connections to past offenses—without judicial oversight. Civil liberties groups decried this as a slide into preventive policing, where documentation became a pretext for surveillance. The risk of data exploitation extends beyond domestic borders. In 2023, a Russian-linked cyber group infiltrated a regional law enforcement database, exfiltrating hundreds of Idaho murder case files. Though no charges followed, the breach exposed victims' addresses, medical records, and family details—some of which

A 2024 study by the University of Idaho projects that by 2030, 60% of unresolved homicides in rural counties will involve incomplete records, effectively rendering them legally invisible. This creates a feedback loop: fewer

convictions lead to reduced funding, which further degrades documentation capacity. Technologically, the rise of artificial intelligence in legal analysis will amplify both promise and peril.
