These aesthetic choices are not merely decorative; they are ideological, framing the critique of consumerism as both timeless and timely. From a risk analysis standpoint, the film’s global rollout exposes Warner Bros. to cultural missteps. In conservative Middle Eastern markets, marketing materials were adjusted to avoid overt sexualization, while in

parts of Eastern Europe, historical references to Victorian morality were recontextualized to align with local narratives of resilience and rebirth.
