In Turkey, the AKP's dominance has been sustained not only through patronage but through strategic manipulation of digital platforms—deploying state-aligned bots, controlling media narratives, and leveraging nationalist sentiment amplified online. Conversely, in India, social media has enabled grassroots mobilization across caste, religion, and class lines, yet simultaneously deepened polarization through viral misinformation and identity-based echo chambers. The edition examines these dynamics through a comparative lens: how authoritarian regimes in Hungary and Russia use digital surveillance and disinformation networks to consolidate power, while liberal democracies like Germany and Canada struggle with balancing free expression and platform accountability. It highlights the concept of “platform governance” as a new frontier of comparative analysis—where private tech firms wield quasi-public authority over political discourse, challenging traditional notions of state sovereignty and media regulation. Moreover, the economic underpinnings of media systems are scrutinized: the decline of public service broadcasting, the rise of subscription models, and the concentration of digital advertising revenue in a handful of U.S. tech giants. These shifts redefine political communication, often favoring emotional resonance over reasoned debate, and creating asymmetries that advantage populist movements with strong narrative control.
