The 369th was born from this pressure: a regiment largely composed of men from New York's Harlem, drawn from the 15th New York National Guard, organized into the 369th Infantry Brigade under the 93rd Division. Origins in Segregation and Resistance

France, having lost millions, welcomed Black troops as combatants with fewer racial restrictions. Under French command, the 369th trained rigorously, adopting French tactics and discipline, while simultaneously fueling American demand for equal status. By June 1918, the regiment was integrated into the U.S. Army's frontline, a move that transformed their role from tolerated auxiliaries to recognized warriors. Brooks documents how this shift was not merely administrative: it was a military necessity. The French had proven Black soldiers could fight at the highest levels, and American leadership, under pressure from both soldiers and public opinion, could not ignore their potential.

Combat in the Trenches: The Battle of Belleau Wood and the Birth of a Legend

It was in the muddy expanse of Belleau Wood—just 40 miles from the German front—that the 369th carved its name into history. From June 26 to July 9, 1918, the regiment engaged in brutal, relentless combat against entrenched German forces. The battle became a crucible of endurance, where the Hellfighters earned their most enduring moniker: the “Harlem Hellfighters.” The origin of the nickname remains contested—some trace it to

We fought like men who had nothing left to lose—and nothing to prove.” The regiment’s losses were severe: over 1,000 casualties, including 197 killed. Yet their resilience shattered German morale. By the battle’s end, they had held the sector at a cost of nearly 2,000 men, a testament to both tactical discipline and sheer will. Brooks underscores that Belleau Wood was more than a tactical engagement—it was a turning point in the army’s perception. The Hellfighters’ performance, broadcast via wire services and wartime propaganda, challenged prevailing stereotypes of Black inferiority. The U.S. entered the war with a commitment to self-determination, yet its military and society remained deeply segregated. The regiment's experience mirrored broader tensions: the nation fought to "make the world safe for democracy" while denying democratic rights at home. Photographs of Black soldiers in uniform—disciplined, proud—circulated in Black press outlets, countering white supremacist caricatures. Brooks details how these images became tools of resistance, redefining Black masculinity and patriotism. Yet media narratives were double-edged. Mainstream white publications often framed the regiment’s heroism through paternalistic or exoticizing lenses, emphasizing their “exotic” bravery while downplaying systemic racism. The French, by contrast, covered them with genuine respect, publishing front-page headlines that celebrated their courage—a contrast that

deepened American shame. Brooks argues this disparity was pivotal: international validation forced the U.S. to confront its hypocrisy. As historian Edward E. Baptist observes, ‘The Hellfighters’ global recognition made America’s racial contradictions impossible to ignore.’ The military-industrial complex also played a role. Arsenal branches supplying the regiment became sites of negotiation—Black workers and soldiers advocating for fair treatment, sometimes succeeding in incremental gains. Brooks documents how the 369th’s demand for equal pay (eventually granted under French command) pressured U.S. leaders to reconsider segregation policies, albeit slowly. The regiment’s legacy thus extended beyond combat: it catalyzed institutional change, however partial.

Despite their valor, the Hellfighters faced profound risks—not only battlefield casualties but systemic discrimination. The Harlem Hellfighters' impact reverberates through military, political, and cultural spheres. Their service laid groundwork for the 1948 desegregation of the U.S. Armed Forces under Truman. The visibility of Black combat excellence helped dismantle stereotypes, influencing the civil rights movement's strategic framing of equality as a national, not racial, issue. In contemporary discourse, the Hellfighters' legacy is invoked in debates over military justice, veteran care, and
