narrative of survival, resilience, and exploitation. Geopolitical and Economic Underpinnings The book's emergence cannot be divorced from the global economic architecture of the 2010s. Neoliberal policy frameworks, particularly austerity measures in Europe and austerity-adjacent reforms in emerging markets, systematically eroded public investment in childcare and social welfare. In nations like Greece, where state-funded childcare collapsed post-2010, or South Africa, where 70% of households rely on informal care, the demand for paid or peer-supported care intensified. Simultaneously, the digital economy's expansion created new labor opportunities—especially for women in regions with limited formal employment. Platform capitalism, fueled by venture capital and data-driven matching systems, capitalized on this demand. Companies like Care.com, Sittercity, and regional equivalents (e.g., Babysitter.in in India, Mama's List in Nigeria) began monetizing trust through verified profiles, background checks, and algorithmic compatibility. Yet **Moms on Call** diverged from purely transactional models. It positioned itself as a counter-narrative: a space where care was not just exchanged but honored—where mothers' expertise, emotional labor, and responsibility were acknowledged as valuable, dignified work. The book's structure reflects this duality: it juxtaposes raw personal stories—of a Somali refugee mother in Minneapolis balancing remote work with babysitting, a single mother in Mumbai monetizing overnight watches while managing chronic illness—with rigorous analysis of platform

governance, labor classification, and the psychological toll of curated authenticity. This synthesis exposes how care capitalism operates at the intersection of empathy and extraction. Industry Impact: Redefining Care Work and Market Norms The **Moms on Call Book** catalyzed a reevaluation of care labor across policy, business, and cultural discourse. In the United States, it informed legislative debates around paid family leave and portable benefits. In the European Union, it was cited in the 2023 Social Rights Action Plan, which explicitly recognizes “care work” as a fundamental right deserving statutory protection. In India, startups like **NurtureBox** and **CareMate** cited its insights to redesign their platforms with mental health safeguards and transparent pay scales.
