underreported due to cultural stigma and legal barriers to public visibility, estimates suggest 160,000 people experience street homelessness—largely elderly and disabled, excluded from formal support. In Brazil, urban centers like São Paulo host sprawling informal settlements where homelessness intersects with gang affiliation and state violence, reflecting deeper failures of urban planning and racial equity. In India, homelessness is intertwined with caste exclusion and informal labor precarity, rarely acknowledged in public discourse despite growing urban migration.
