The global mobility of NICU nurses is a defining trend. Driven by market demand and economic inequality, “nurse migration corridors” have emerged: from the Philippines and India to Gulf states, from Eastern Europe to North America. Despite these differences, a global baseline is forming: competency in technology (ECMO management, tele-neonatology), adherence to international safety standards (Joint Commission International), and documented experience in multi-disciplinary teams. This convergence signals a maturing global standard, even as local adaptations preserve cultural and systemic specificity.

Forward-Looking Projections and Strategic Implications
