The Poetic Edda, in its raw form, emerged from this oral milieu—a collection of *dróttkvætt*-style poems, each structured around complex alliterative verse and kennings, metaphors rooted in nature and myth. These poems encoded not only stories of gods and monsters but also social values, ethical codes, and cosmological beliefs. A skald reciting *Hávamál*, for instance, was not merely entertaining; he was transmitting wisdom, lineage, and the unwritten rules of *þjóð*—the people. The historical context of their emergence is critical. Viking Age Scandinavia was a patchwork of petty kingdoms, clan alliances, and shifting power balances. Religion was decentralized, polytheistic, and deeply tied to the land—sacred groves, mountain peaks, and ancestral burial mounds served as ritual sites. The gods (*þrór*), giants (*jötnn*), and heroes (*óðinn*-related figures) mirrored the social and environmental world: storms as divine wrath, seafaring as fateful destiny, and kinship as sacred bond. These narratives functioned as mnemonic maps, guiding behavior, reinforcing social hierarchies, and legitimizing leadership through divine association. Yet oral transmission carried risks—forgetting, variation, and cultural drift. The transition from oral to written preservation, particularly under Christian influence, was not a neutral act. The *Fateyjarbók* (1387), compiled by Catholic scholar Árni Magnússon, exemplifies this: it preserved Eddic verses within a Christian chronicle, framing Norse myth as a precursor to Christian salvation. This recontextualization embedded the Eddas in a new ideological framework, altering their reception. The 13th century, when Snorri authored his Prose Edda, was a pivotal moment—where pagan lore met Christian scholasticism, producing a text that was both a cultural archive and a political statement of Norse identity amid consolidation. Scholars such as Anders Revold emphasize that the Eddas' survival depended on their adaptability
