As healthcare systems globally prioritize prevention to curb rising chronic disease burdens, dental hygiene must evolve from an ancillary service to a central pillar. This demands interprofessional collaboration—dentists, hygienists, nurses, and public health officials working in tandem—and policy innovation that recognizes oral health as inseparable from overall health. Countries leading this transition—such as Finland,
