The adaptation was not just visual but ideological—transforming the bagel from a Western snack into a symbol of inclusive democracy. This localization underscores how global symbols are always reinterpreted through national lenses. In Latin America, particularly in Argentina and Brazil, street vendors began selling "bagels liberales"—customized with local spices and political slogans—turning the snack into a grassroots form of political expression. These versions reject both Western branding and elite liberalism, instead embodying a bottom-up, multilingual version of the bagel's symbolic power. Across Europe, responses diverged. In Sweden, where consensus-driven politics emphasize pragmatism,

the phrase was mocked as “café nihilism”—a hollow gesture masking apathy. In contrast, France’s intellectual circles debated its philosophical implications: was it a postmodern rejection of grand narratives, or a surrender to superficiality? These contrasts reveal that while the bagel circulates globally, its meaning is always contested, contextual, and culturally inflected. This global diffusion highlights a key insight: liberalism’s symbolic expressions are not monolithic. The bagel, in its adaptability, becomes a mirror—reflecting each society’s unique anxieties, aspirations, and interpretations. Its power lies not in universality, but in its capacity to be remade.

Expert Perspectives: From Theory to Practice
