In the aftermath of the 1950s-60s dam-building boom, nations like Egypt, India, and the United States faced recurring droughts that exposed the peril of unbridled abstraction. The 1977 U.S. Drought of the Southwest, which reduced Lake Mead to historic lows, catalyzed a shift: operators began implementing automatic cut-offs at 30% capacity, but retained manual override to prevent irreversible depletion. The manual reset feature became a critical safeguard—ensuring that technology did not outpace

accountability. It was a recognition that water, as both resource and right, could not be ceded entirely to algorithmic logic. Economically, the low water cut-off with manual reset reshaped industrial behavior.
