As a transit zone for migration and illicit flows, Mexico bears disproportionate pressure from US policy and regional instability. Yet domestically, the state's capacity to respond is weakened by corruption, weak institutions, and fiscal constraints. The questions reflect this asymmetry. When asked about security, a farmer from San Cristóbal de las Casas replied: “La frontera la protegen los carteles.
