In France, the *Conseil Supérieur des Métiers* administers rigorous civil service exams to ensure meter readers represent diverse socioeconomic backgrounds, countering historical underrepresentation. Yet, in the UK, post-2010 austerity measures led to reduced funding for meter reader training programs, shifting certification costs onto candidates and sparking protests over equity.
