The Greek **epitaphion**—funerary epigrams inscribed on tombs—often celebrated martial valor or civic virtue, reflecting the polis's emphasis on honor and legacy. Roman **funerae** incorporated elegiac couplets and laments that balanced stoicism with emotional release, a tension that persists in contemporary selections. Cicero's speeches, while not poetic per se, reveal how rhetorical form shaped communal mourning, a precedent for the performative power of language in death rituals. The medieval period saw the fusion of Christian liturgy and vernacular poetry, particularly in Europe. Gregorian chant melodies paired with Latin elegies at monastic funerals, but it was the vernacular lyric—whether in Old English **elegy** or French **dirge**—that allowed grief to be articulated in the native tongue, democratizing access to mourning. The **Danse Macabre** tradition, blending poetry with visual satire, underscored mortality's universality, while troubadour laments preserved personal sorrow within courtly codes. The modern era transformed funeral poetry through industrialization, urbanization, and globalization. In Western press, a dignified reading by a renowned poet may receive sympathetic coverage, while grassroots, community-led performances—often in local dialects or oral forms—remain underreported.
