The OpenID Connect protocol and FIDO2 standards enable phishing-resistant authentication, reducing identity theft risks. Yet reliance on centralized platforms introduces single points of failure and vendor lock-in.

Finally, portability and interoperability:

True ownership requires data mobility. The European Union's eIDAS Regulation sets a benchmark, mandating cross-border recognition of digital identities. A birth record issued in Sweden must be verifiable and usable in France, provided both nations adhere to eIDAS standards. However, global fragmentation persists—many countries lack interoperable systems, forcing individuals to re-verify identity across borders, undermining the promise of seamless ownership.
