The Motor Carrier Act of 1980 dismantled decades of Interstate Commerce Commission oversight, accelerating freight movement and amplifying demand for certified drivers. Concurrently, high-profile accidents involving warehouse and material-handling vehicles—including collisions linked to untrained or improperly licensed operators—spurred state-level reforms. Kentucky responded by integrating CDL requirements into municipal licensing frameworks, with Bowling Green's workforce development boards recognizing the necessity of standardized training for roles supporting not just bowling alleys, but the broader logistics backbone of the city.
