The result is a system where 7th graders consistently outperform global averages in problem-solving adaptability. In contrast, India's rapid digital expansion—driven by startups like BYJU'S and Toppr—sees 7th graders absorbing vast volumes of content via mobile apps, often under intense exam pressure. While these platforms scale access, the high-stakes environment fosters anxiety, with 41% of students surveyed reporting math-related stress. The lack of regulatory oversight in edtech further risks superficial learning and inequitable outcomes. China's "double reduction" policy (2021) seeks to curb excessive homework and commercialization, shifting focus to quality over quantity. Math apps like Skolarly emphasize rigorous practice within structured curricula, balancing digital efficiency with teacher oversight. This hybrid model shows promise in sustaining rigor while mitigating burnout. These global models underscore a central insight: technology is not inherently transformative. Its impact depends on governance, pedagogical intent, and cultural alignment. The most effective systems integrate digital tools as complements—not

replacements—for skilled teaching, equitable access, and meaningful curriculum design.
