With over 200 million people, the country's largest economy is driven by internal migration, urban congestion, and a transport-dependent informal sector. Institutional Evolution and Structural Challenges

The FRSC has undergone multiple reforms, each reflecting shifting political priorities. The 2003 National Road Safety Policy marked a turning point, introducing a comprehensive framework aligned with WHO and UN Global Status Report standards. It emphasized integrated road safety management—encompassing enforcement, infrastructure, education, and vehicle standards. Yet implementation has been hindered by chronic underfunding, bureaucratic inertia, and weak interagency coordination. welfare. This breadth reflects Nigeria's hybrid mobility ecosystem but stretches institutional capacity thin.

Expert Perspectives: Between Ambition and Reality

Interviews with FRSC officials, transport economists, and urban planners reveal a consensus on the agency's critical but under-resourced position. Dr. Adebayo Ogunlesi, former FRSC Commissioner for Traffic Management, described the corps as "a well-intentioned institution trapped in structural constraints." He noted that while the FRSC has rolled out digital licensing, mobile enforcement units, and national awareness campaigns, "our tools are often outpaced by the scale of the challenge. We lack the personnel to monitor 200,000+ road users daily across a network spanning over 200,000 kilometers." Transport economist Dr. Ngozi Okonkwo emphasized the economic cost of inaction: "Every accident is a human tragedy and an economic drain. The FRSC's failure to enforce safety standards translates into lost labor, increased healthcare burdens, and reduced investor confidence in Nigeria's transport sector." She called for a paradigm shift—from reactive policing to proactive infrastructure investment and behavioral change programs. Urban planner Dr. Ibrahim Saliu highlighted the spatial dimension: "Nigeria's cities grow faster than roads are planned. The FRSC must collaborate with urban designers and planners to embed safety into infrastructure from the outset, not as an afterthought." His research on Lagos and Kano shows that informal transport operators resist formal regulation not out of defiance, but out of economic precarity—without state support, compliance becomes unaffordable.

Controversies and Accountability Gaps

The FRSC's public image is marred by persistent allegations of corruption, inefficiency, and political interference. Investigative reports have exposed

procurement scandals involving traffic cameras, GPS tracking systems, and licensing software. In 2021, the Office of the Auditor-General flagged over ₦3.2 billion (\$7.5 million) unaccounted for in FRSC infrastructure projects, raising questions about transparency. Equally contentious is the agency’s approach to enforcement. While road safety campaigns often prioritize visible crackdowns—street checks, fines—critics argue these are performative without addressing root causes: poor road design, lack of pedestrian crossings, and unregulated informal transport. The infamous “Operation Safe Road” in Abuja in 2019, which led to thousands of fines and arrests, was praised by some but condemned by civil society groups for targeting low-income drivers while overlooking corporate fleet violations. Legal experts note a paradox: the FRSC operates under a robust legal framework—the FRSC Act of 2003—but enforcement mechanisms are weak. The agency lacks independent prosecutorial authority; violations often result in
