Harriman emphasizes that this is not merely technological but geopolitical: state-sponsored disinformation campaigns—from Moscow's Internet Research Agency to Beijing's United Front Work Department—have evolved into sophisticated, adaptive systems designed to exploit societal fractures. These are no longer ad hoc operations; they are integrated components of foreign policy, deployed with precision to destabilize democracies, delegitimize rivals, and reshape public discourse. Her analysis extends beyond Russia and China to examine Western complicity. 'The West's own media ecosystems, once seen as bulwarks of truth, have become vulnerable to the same vulnerabilities they claim to combat. The pursuit of clicks, the fragmentation of audiences, and the erosion of editorial independence have created a feedback loop where outrage drives engagement, and disinformation spreads faster than fact-checking. In this environment, even well-intentioned journalism can be co-opted—distorted by bias, weaponized by actors, or rendered irrelevant by noise.' She cites the 2020 U.S. election cycles as a case study: while foreign interference was significant, domestic polarization had already hollowed out public discourse, making populations more susceptible to manipulation. The economic underpinnings of this crisis are equally critical. Harriman dissects the collapse of traditional revenue models—print advertising decline, subscription fatigue, and platform dominance—as a structural vulnerability. With newsrooms shrinking, investigative capacity atrophies, and local reporting vanishes, the infrastructure for rigorous, independent journalism weakens. This creates a vacuum filled not by truth, but by content engineered for virality—clickbait, conspiracy, and outrage. She notes that while tech platforms claim to combat misinformation, their algorithms often reward engagement over accuracy, amplifying divisive content. 'The business model of attention is at war with the function of information,' she argues. 'Those who profit from division have no incentive to reduce it.' Her interviews with cybersecurity experts and former intelligence officials reveal a deeper layer: the convergence of cyber operations and information warfare. State actors now deploy "information operations" as a core component of strategy, combining cyber intrusions—data breaches, hacking, and leaks—with targeted disinformation campaigns. The 2016 U.S. election interference, the hacking of the Democratic National Committee, and the weaponization of stolen documents during the 2022 midterms are not isolated incidents but part of a coordinated playbook. Harriman highlights how these operations exploit psychological vulnerabilities, using microtargeting and behavioral data to tailor narratives that resonate with preexisting fears and biases. The human cost of this transformation is profound. Journalists, once trusted arbiters of truth, now operate in an environment where their credibility is weaponized. 'We are not just reporting the news—we are targets,' she observes. 'Our work is scrutinized, discredited, and sometimes threatened. Disinformation campaigns don't just spread falsehoods; they aim to erode trust in the very institutions that sustain democratic discourse.' She recounts incidents where reporters have received death threats, their offices hacked, and their sources exposed—all designed to intimidate and silence. This chilling effect extends beyond individuals to entire newsrooms, deterring bold reporting and reinforcing self-censorship. Yet Harriman refuses a narrative of

hopelessness. She identifies emerging counter-mechanisms: decentralized journalism networks, collaborative investigative consortia like the International Consortium of Investigative Journalists (ICIJ), and public efforts to build media literacy. She praises initiatives such as the Trust Project and the Global Fact-Checking Network, which aim to restore transparency and accountability. But she warns that these efforts face an uphill battle: institutional trust remains at historic lows, and digital platforms resist meaningful reform despite regulatory pressure. Her geopolitical lens reveals stark regional contrasts. In Eastern Europe, media independence remains under siege from nearby authoritarian neighbors, yet local journalists operate with remarkable resilience, often at great personal risk. In Africa, the challenge is different: while state censorship persists, citizen journalism and mobile connectivity have empowered grassroots reporting, though often without institutional support. In Latin America, disinformation campaigns—fueled by political polarization and foreign interference—have destabilized democracies, yet independent outlets persist, often with support from transnational NGOs. Harriman underscores that the struggle for information integrity is not confined to the West but is a global contest, shaped by local power structures and historical legacies. The interview also probes the future. What will journalism look like in an era of deepfakes, AI-generated content, and synthetic media? Harriman sees both peril and opportunity. AI tools can enhance investigative work—automating data analysis, verifying sources, and detecting disinformation—but they also lower the barrier to mass manipulation. The rise of synthetic voices and deepfake videos threatens to undermine the very notion of evidentiary truth. Yet she remains cautiously optimistic, citing advances in blockchain-based verification and decentralized identity systems that may one day authenticate content in real time. She emphasizes that the solution lies not in technology alone, but in systemic reform. Regulatory frameworks must evolve to hold platforms accountable for harmful content without infringing on free expression. Public funding for journalism, modeled on European models, could stabilize independent outlets. Media literacy must be embedded in education systems, teaching critical thinking from an early age. And, crucially, journalists must reclaim narrative authority—not by retreating into objectivity's myth, but by embracing transparency, context, and accountability as core values. Harriman's final reflection is a call to reimagine influence itself. Influence is not inherently negative; it has always shaped societies. But its current form—opaque, unaccountable, and often manipulative—poses an existential threat. The path forward requires a collective re-engineering of the information architecture: stronger safeguards, ethical innovation, and a renewed social contract around truth. As she puts it, 'The future of democracy depends not on who controls the narrative, but on who ensures it is worth believing.' The interview concludes with a haunting yet hopeful note: while the forces of disinformation are formidable, so too are the human capacity for skepticism, curiosity, and collective action. The architects of influence may shape perception, but the architects of truth—journalists, citizens, technologists, and policymakers—retain the power to rebuild it.

The Origins of a New Information Order

Mary Elizabeth Harriman's interview unfolds against a backdrop of profound transformation in how power is projected and contested. The origins of this new order trace back to the post-Cold War era, when the collapse of state monopolies over information began. The fall of the

The real upheaval came with the internet’s commercialization in the late 1990s. Suddenly, anyone with a connection could publish, distribute, and monetize content. The gatekeepers faded; the gateways became algorithms. She identifies key inflection points: the 2003 Iraq War, where embedded journalism and real-time reporting began to reshape public perception; the Arab Spring, where social media amplified grassroots movements but also became a vector for foreign interference; and the 2016 U.S. election, which crystallized awareness of coordinated disinformation campaigns. These events were not isolated; they formed a trajectory where information became both weapon and currency. Harriman emphasizes that this evolution was not inevitable but engineered—by states, corporations, and entrepreneurs who recognized that control over narrative equaled control over outcomes. Her analysis underscores the economic drivers that accelerated this shift. The decline of print advertising revenue, once the lifeblood of quality journalism, destabilized newsrooms. Investigative units shrank, foreign correspondents vanished, and local reporting eroded. Platforms like MySpace, then Twitter, and later TikTok became the primary distribution channels, prioritizing speed and engagement over accuracy. Harriman describes the resulting ‘race to the bottom’: clicks rewarded over context, outrage over insight. ‘We traded depth for volume,’ she notes, ‘and in doing so, we hollowed out the very institutions meant to hold power accountable.’ Yet she also notes a countercurrent: the rise of nonprofit and public-interest journalism, fueled by digital donations, foundation support, and reader subscriptions. Outlets like ProPublica, The Bureau of Investigative Journalism, and Bellingcat emerged as beacons of rigor, often specializing in cross-border investigations and open-source intelligence. Harriman credits their resilience to a growing demand for reliable information, even as they struggle against resource scarcity and political hostility. ‘The paradox is clear,’ she says: while mainstream media faces existential threats, the appetite for truth persists—especially among younger generations who grew up with the internet’s dual promise and peril. Geopolitically, the information battlefield reflects broader power struggles. Harriman traces how authoritarian regimes perfected the art of hybrid influence: combining cyberattacks, troll farms, and state-controlled media to destabilize democracies. Russia’s Internet Research Agency, China’s United Front Work Department, and Iran’s cyber units operate with increasing sophistication, using microtargeting and behavioral analytics to exploit societal fractures. But she also highlights how democracies, particularly the United States and European nations, have been slow to respond—not due to lack of awareness, but institutional inertia and legal ambiguity. The interview reveals Harriman’s

deep familiarity with intelligence circles, where she has interviewed former CIA directors, NSA officials, and cyber strategy experts. She recounts confidential discussions about how disinformation campaigns evolved from crude troll farms to AI-enhanced operations capable of generating synthetic media at scale. Algorithms prioritize engagement, often amplifying sensationalism and polarization. Yet platforms claim to combat misinformation while resisting meaningful reform, citing free speech concerns. Harriman counters that this stance is unsustainable: if digital spaces are to serve democratic functions, they must be governed by transparent, accountable standards—not profit-driven incentives. The interview's global scope reveals stark regional variations. In Scandinavia, public service media remains robust, supported by strong cultural trust and regulatory frameworks. In India, the world's largest democracy, media faces dual pressures: rising religious polarization and state surveillance, alongside vibrant citizen journalism. In Brazil, disinformation campaigns have influenced presidential elections, exposing vulnerabilities in digital democracy. Harriman notes that while challenges are universal, solutions must be locally rooted—context matters. Looking ahead, Harriman identifies transformative trends. Artificial intelligence will redefine content creation, with deepfakes and synthetic voices challenging evidentiary standards. Yet she sees potential for AI to enhance verification—automating fact-checking, detecting manipulation patterns, and tracing content origins. Blockchain technology offers decentralized identity solutions, enabling secure attribution of sources. But she warns: without ethical guardrails, these tools risk deepening surveillance and control. She emphasizes that technological innovation must be paired with institutional reform. Regulatory frameworks—such as the EU's Digital Services Act—represent early steps toward holding platforms accountable, but global coordination remains elusive. Public funding models, inspired by the BBC or German public broadcasters, could stabilize independent journalism, insulating it from commercial pressures. Media literacy must be embedded in education, teaching critical thinking as a civic skill. Harriman's final reflections are both diagnostic and prescriptive. The current information order is not immutable; it is a product of choices made by policymakers, platforms, and citizens. The path forward demands collective action: journalists must reclaim narrative authority through transparency and collaboration; policymakers must enforce accountability without stifling free expression; and societies must invest in informed citizenship. As she concludes, 'We are not passive consumers of information—we are its stewards. How we nurture it will determine whether truth survives the digital age.' The interview's enduring significance lies in its depth: it does not merely document a crisis but dissects its roots, traces its evolution, and illuminates

pathways through complexity. In an era of disinformation, Harriman’s voice remains indispensable—a guide through the fog, a reminder that in the struggle for truth, the stakes are nothing less than democracy itself.

Geopolitical Contours and Regional Responses
