The hippo-carrying boat destabilized suddenly, its hull twisting violently

before flipping end over end. The impact was immediate: fuel spilled in a volatile cloud, igniting in a firestorm that consumed rescue efforts before they could reach the water's edge. Thirteen people—including three children—were in the boat. Twelve perished instantly; one survivor, a young woman named Kemi, clung to a fragment of the deck, her body recovered hours later, battered and hypothermic
