The Russian School, by contrast, privileges **pathos**—a deep, almost spiritual engagement with the music’s emotional core. This divergence reflects deeper cultural values: Russian pedagogy sees the pianist as a vessel of collective feeling, whereas Western traditions often position the performer as a technical maestro. Oborin emphasized **osnovnaya pianistika**—the foundational piano technique—not merely as mechanical execution but as a vehicle for musical storytelling. Yet paradoxically, this crisis accelerated the global diffusion of Book 2's principles. As former faculty—including Tsybulev, Maria Youdina, and Vladimir Spivakov—settled in Europe and North America, they carried their pedagogical worldview with them, establishing private studios and teaching roles that spread the method organically.
