The South China Sea disputes, involving China, the Philippines, Malaysia, Brunei, and Taiwan, have intensified maritime tensions, with frequent incursions and militarization of artificial islands. While officially advocating “peaceful coexistence” and multilateral diplomacy, Vietnam has deepened defense partnerships with the U.S., Japan, and India—conducting joint naval exercises and acquiring defense technology. The push for “friendshoring” and nearshoring has amplified interest in Vietnam as a manufacturing alternative to China. However, to sustain this trajectory, the country must upgrade infrastructure, enhance workforce skills, and strengthen legal frameworks. The recent emphasis on green industries—solar, EV batteries, sustainable agriculture—signals a strategic pivot toward future-proofing the economy.
