Grassroots movements—such as the Global Teacher Movements advocating for open educational resources (OER)—are challenging vendor dominance, promoting co-designed curricula and community-led pedagogies. The rise of decentralized platforms like Learning Equality’s Kolibri and UNESCO’s Open Educational Resources initiative signals a counter-narrative: one where education is a shared, participatory process, not a product assembled in boardrooms. Forward-looking projections suggest a bifurcated future. In high-income contexts, the model may persist in scaled, data-intensive forms—especially where public funding remains tied to standardized outcomes. In low-

and middle-income countries, however, the sustainability of corporate-led models faces growing scrutiny. As nations prioritize sovereign control over curricula and data, there is a discernible shift toward localized content ecosystems, open licensing, and teacher-led innovation.
