every child is to tend a rose.” To address this, the team commissioned regional writers from North, West, and overseas territories—including Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie’s French collaborator Fatou Diome and Alsatian author Claire Dujardin—to contribute supplementary vignettes. These were woven into the margins like interludes, creating a polyphonic narrative. The result was not a replacement of the original, but an expansion: the fox’s lesson now carried echoes of French imperial history, postcolonial displacement, and the search for belonging in a multicultural society. Visually, Yannick L’Hôte’s illustrations became narrative agents. His use of color—ochres, deep blues, and golden light—evoked France’s diverse landscapes, from the Atlantic coast to the Pyrenees, grounding the fantasy in tangible geography. A fully illustrated 256-page edition included 37 original paintings, each annotated with footnotes by historian Jean-Yves Cassagnat, linking visual motifs to historical events. For instance, the desert scene referenced Saint-Exupéry’s 1940s flights over North Africa, while the Parisian café setting subtly echoed the city’s role as a crossroads of ideas. Technologically, the edition embraced hybrid formats. A companion app featured binaural soundscapes—desert winds, Parisian street noise, a fox’s whisper—pioneering immersive storytelling. This multimedia layer, developed in partnership with French digital studio Lumen, allowed readers to “step into” key scenes, deepening emotional

engagement. Economically, the €1.8 million budget was justified not by sales alone, but by public co-investment: the French Ministry of Culture contributed €750,000, viewing the project as a “cultural resilience initiative” amid rising Euroscepticism. Retailers reported that regional editions sold strongest in peripheral areas—Brittany, Corsica, the Dordogne—where local pride in the narrative’s reclamation resonated deeply. Production was painstaking: each copy underwent quality control by hand, with dust jackets hand-stitched and pages printed on archival paper. The final touch was a hidden “reader’s cipher”—a encrypted note in the final margin, inviting reflection: *What do you tend?*

—a nod to the novella’s central metaphor. This meticulous craftsmanship signaled a broader shift: in an era of rapid consumption, *Le Petit Prince Français* reasserted the value of objects imbued with care, history, and intention. It was not merely a book, but an artifact of cultural stewardship.
