In the U.S., Proposition 12 (2018) redefined confinement standards, forcing producers to adapt—or exit—markets governed by these norms. Yet global adoption lags. In India, smallholders resist costly upgrades, fearing exclusion from formal markets dominated by handbook-compliant processors. Environmental risks further expose the Handbook's limitations.
