The linguistic roots of “may God guide you” lie in the Hebrew benediction, most explicitly in the Priestly Blessing (Numbers 6:24–26), where the priestly class utters: “The Lord give His grace to you and grant you peace.” This formula—“the Lord give His grace” (Hebrew: *chavda’ Adonai*)—was not initially a personal supplication but a communal invocation, a divine endorsement meant to sanctify role, mission, and destiny. Over time, the phrase diffused through Abrahamic traditions, adapted into Aramaic, Arabic, and later European vernaculars, each layer embedding new cultural significances. In medieval Christian Europe, it became a common litany uttered at coronations, military campaigns, and pilgrimages—framed as divine sanction for leadership, justice, or conquest. Yet its resonance extended far beyond theology: it functioned as a legitimizing ritual, aligning human action with cosmic order. The phrase’s global migration accelerated during the age of empire. European colonial powers, often operating under the doctrine of divine mission—“the civilizing mission”—invoked a sacred mandate to “guide” both colonizers and the colonized. Missionaries carried “may God guide you” into Africa, Asia, and the Americas not as neutral prayer, but as part of a civilizational project. In India
