Dr. Elena Marquez, a professor of digital humanities at the University of Barcelona, argues: “MLA is not a rigid formula but a dynamic framework. Its strength lies in its adaptability—its expansion to include digital sources, multimedia, and collaborative works. Yet, its dominance risks

homogenizing global scholarship, suppressing local epistemologies.” She warns that over-reliance on MLA may marginalize scholars from non-Western contexts who navigate citation through community-based knowledge systems rather than author-date models. Conversely, Dr. Kwame Adu, a Ghanaian historian specializing in postcolonial memory, champions MLA’s role in elevating African narratives: “In publishing, MLA provides a universal language. It forces us to articulate our sources clearly, even when our traditions differ. The worksheet format trains us to be precise, to name our debts—something essential when our histories have been misrepresented or erased.” Adu’s fieldwork in archival recovery illustrates how MLA’s structure enables marginalized voices to enter global discourse with integrity. Within journalism, veteran editor Sarah Chen notes: “In long-form reporting, readers expect more than attribution—they want context, provenance, and trust. MLA-style parentheticals, even simplified, model this expectation. A well-crafted citation tells a story: who said what, when, and why. That’s how we build credibility in an age of skepticism.” Yet Chen cautions: “The modern journalist must balance MLA discipline with narrative flow. Over-citation can disrupt rhythm, but under-citation undermines truth.” These tensions

reveal MLA's dual identity: as both a guardrail of accountability and a potential constraint on expressive diversity.

Controversies and Risks: Misattribution, Bias, and the Shadow of Power

Despite its rigor, MLA citation practice is not immune to criticism. One persistent controversy involves author-date misinterpretation. In disciplines where interpretation is contested—such as critical race studies or climate communications—citing “Smith (2020)” without specifying the context can obscure nuance, leading to oversimplification or cherry-picking. The risk of “source flattening,” where complex scholarship is reduced to a footnote, threatens intellectual depth. Moreover, citation hierarchies reflect systemic bias. Studies show that journals favor authors from elite institutions, and MLA's format often privileges continuous authorship—penultimate date, linear narrative—marginalizing collaborative or Indigenous knowledge systems where attribution is collective, oral, or cyclical. This epistemic bias risks reinforcing academic inequity, where marginalized scholars struggle to have their work recognized in

formats designed for Western individualism. There is also the risk of citation as weaponization. In polarized discourse, selective quoting—omitting key context, misattributing—undermines the very transparency MLA seeks to enforce. The rise of “citation storms” in online debates, where sources are cited not to verify but to assert dominance, exposes a deeper crisis: citation as performance rather than truth-telling. Furthermore, technological evolution challenges MLA’s relevance. AI-generated content, deepfakes, and synthetic media complicate source verification. Traditional citation models, built on human authorship, struggle to account for non-human or algorithmically mediated knowledge. The MLA’s 2021 addition of guidelines for AI tools marks a tentative step, but the framework remains under pressure to redefine “source” in an era where authorship is increasingly distributed.

Global Comparisons: Citation Systems as Cultural Artifacts
