The

resulting war redefined colonial power, dismantling British mercantilist dominance and setting the stage for the U.S. to emerge as an independent economic actor. This geopolitical evolution had lasting implications. The colonies' integration into global trade networks not only fueled their economic growth but also embedded them in transnational systems of labor, finance, and conflict. The legacy of this Atlantic entanglement persists in contemporary debates over globalization, supply chain resilience, and the enduring influence of historical trade patterns on national economic policy.

This framework helps explain the rapid radicalization following events like the Stamp Act and Boston Tea Party, as colonists interpreted British policies not as administrative adjustments but as existential threats to self-rule. Economists such as Douglass North have analyzed the colonial economy through the lens of institutional development, noting how property rights, trade regulations, and labor systems shaped long-term economic outcomes. North's work on transaction costs illustrates how colonial institutions—however imperfect—reduced uncertainty and enabled investment, laying the foundation for later capitalist expansion. Yet the persistence of slavery and racial hierarchies introduced deep structural inefficiencies, limiting broader economic inclusion and sowing seeds of future conflict. Global historians like

C.A. Bayly have contextualized the colonies within broader imperial and commercial networks, emphasizing their role as nodes in a global system rather than isolated entities. Bayly's analysis of "imperial complexes" reveals how colonial economies were shaped by transcontinental flows of people, goods, and ideas—evident in the circulation of enslaved Africans, the adoption of British legal frameworks, and the influence of Enlightenment thought on revolutionary ideology. Contemporary scholars, including Jill Lepore and Gary Nash, have further complicated the narrative by foregrounding marginalized voices—Indigenous peoples, enslaved Africans, women, and laborers—whose experiences were often excluded from traditional historiography. Lepore's **The Name of War** (1998) interrogates how colonial violence and mythmaking were intertwined, showing how the narrative of justified revolution obscured the dispossession of Native nations. Nash's work on urban slavery reveals the critical role of enslaved labor in sustaining colonial economies, challenging the myth of a purely agrarian, free-labor society. These diverse perspectives converge on a central insight: the "13 colonies" were not a monolith but a contested, evolving constellation of communities whose identities, economies, and aspirations were shaped by both local conditions and global forces. The framework's elasticity allowed it to absorb regional differences, but it also masked internal tensions—between

freedom and slavery, autonomy and empire, local interest and collective action—that would define the nation’s future.

Yet the American case was distinct in its eventual break from empire and the rapid development of a self-sustaining national economy. Comparisons with settler colonies like Australia or New Zealand reveal both similarities—land dispossession, racial hierarchies—and key differences, particularly in the U.S.’s early constitutional experimentation and territorial expansion.
