The tripartite division of China into Wei, Shu, and Wu was not a stable equilibrium but a dynamic equilibrium of competing equilibria. Each kingdom's survival depended on military prowess, diplomatic maneuvering, and economic sustainability—often in tension. statecraft: projecting strength through perception. Shu's survival depended less on territory than on maintaining a narrative of righteous resistance, a theme that resonated deeply in later Chinese political mythology.

Eastern Wu's geopolitical identity was shaped by its maritime orientation. Its leaders cultivated ties with southern tribes and coastal polities, fostering a hybrid Sinicized-Minority state. The kingdom's naval superiority allowed it to resist Wei's repeated invasions, particularly the massive campaigns of Zhuge Liang's Northern Expeditions. Yet Wu's reliance on sea power also exposed vulnerabilities—piracy, supply chain fragility, and internal court intrigues that culminated in the coup of 280 CE, which ended Shu's brief sovereignty. Wu's fall marked not just military defeat but the irreversible consolidation of northern dominance under Wei.

Cultural Production and the Birth of a National Mythos

Luo Guanzhong's novel was not merely a literary achievement—it was a geopolitical intervention. By embedding historical events within a moral framework, the text naturalized the tripartite order as the natural progression of Chinese civilization: chaos giving way to order, conflict resolved through virtuous leadership. Guan Yu's unwavering loyalty, Zhuge Liang's wisdom, and Zhou Yu's tactical brilliance were not just personal virtues but embodiments of the Confucian ideal of the **junzi**—the noble warrior-statesman. This narrative framework permeated elite and popular culture. In the Song dynasty, scholar-officials referenced the Romance to debate governance; in the Ming, military strategists studied its campaigns. Operas like **The Romance of the Three Kingdoms** (三国演义) transformed the story into performative history, reinforcing regional identities and moral lessons. Even Buddhist and Daoist interpretations emerged—some seeing the fall of Han as karmic consequence, others framing Zhuge Liang's failures as tests of virtue.

Historians remain divided on the Romance's reliability. While Chen Shou's **Sanguo Zhi** is valued
