Expert analysis reveals a bifurcated narrative. On one hand, agricultural economists like Dr. Amara Nkosi of the University of Cape Town argue that these spreadsheets are the “digital backbone of resilient food systems.” They enable granular analysis of herd health, productivity trends, and climate adaptation strategies at sub-national levels. In a 2023 study across East Africa, researchers found that districts using open cattle records reduced livestock mortality by 28% over three years by enabling early detection of disease outbreaks.
