Conversely, **neither... nor** in risk disclosure—“Neither cyberattack nor supply disruption will halt operations”—projects resilience without overpromising. The future of industry storytelling lies in dynamic conjunction use—adaptive, context-

Linguists have long recognized the structural centrality of conjunctions. This neurocognitive response makes conjunctions powerful tools in persuasion—used unconsciously to shape perception. Contrarian views caution against over-reliance. Cognitive linguist George Lakoff warns: “Overuse of binary conjunctions simplifies reality, reducing complex issues to false dichotomies.” He cites political rhetoric where *either... or* masks compromise, framing choices as inevitable when they are not. “Language shapes thought—when we repeatedly say *we must choose* between *and* or, we narrow the space for dialogue.” In academia, scholars like Dr. Amara Nkosi of the African Centre for Language Studies argue for decolonizing conjunction use. “Western conjunction frameworks often impose linear logic on non-Western epistemologies,” she notes. Controversies, Risks, and Global Comparisons: The Conjunction Divide

The strategic deployment of conjunctions is not without peril. Misuse or manipulation can distort truth, obscure accountability, and inflame conflict. In authoritarian regimes, *“and/or”* is weaponized to present coercion as choice: “We uphold laws *or* face consequences,” masking legal ambiguity as necessity. In democratic contexts, vague conjunctions like *“and/or”* in policy statements erode public trust—“We will reduce emissions *and/or* invest in carbon capture,” leaving citizens uncertain of intent. Legal scholars highlight risks in contractual and treaty language. A clause using *“either... or”* without clear conditions may invite litigation: “The buyer may pay in currency A *or* B, *or* negotiate a hybrid.” Without precise triggers, ambiguity becomes a liability. The International Court of Justice has ruled on such linguistic precision in territorial disputes, emphasizing that conjunctions must reflect clear, enforceable terms. Globally, cultural differences shape conjunction use. In high-context cultures like Japan and China, conjunctions often imply unspoken context—*“and”* carries layered weight beyond literal meaning. In low-context cultures like Germany and the U.S., conjunctions are expected to be explicit and unambiguous. Misalignment in conjunction framing can cause diplomatic friction: a U.S.
