The story begins not in a single moment, but in the slow unraveling of the post-Cold War promise that Latin America would shed its authoritarian past and embrace democracy and prosperity. Simultaneously, transnational capital advanced a parallel agenda: extractive industries—mining, agribusiness, energy—deployed legal manipulation, legal impunity, and coercive displacement to seize communal territories. Multinational corporations, often operating with tacit state complicity, became de facto sovereign actors, rendering local populations not just economically disenfranchised, but spiritually adrift—rooted in lands severed from ancestral memory and religious meaning. Castillo meticulously traces how these economic forces intersect with religious authority: in El Salvador, for instance, the rise of megachurches coincided with

the consolidation of right-wing governments that dismantled labor protections and suppressed dissent, creating a symbiosis between spiritual nationalism and capitalist extraction. The result is a landscape where “God” is not absent, but displaced—projected onto consumerist megachurches, privatized salvation, or apocalyptic rhetoric that frames suffering as divine judgment rather than structural failure. Castillo’s fieldwork reveals how this displacement enables ideological closure: communities abandon critical inquiry, seek absolute answers in fundamentalist preaching, and remain silent as their children disappear, their homes burned, their elders silenced.

religious figures, accuse Castillo of reducing faith to a casualty of political failure, thereby undermining spiritual resilience. Yet Castillo counters that her work honors complexity: she does not dismiss belief, but interrogates its conditions. “Spirituality,” she writes, “is not the problem—it is the place where structural violence reveals its face.”

Controversies and Risks: The Cost of Truth in Authoritarian Shadows

So far from God has not been without backlash. In conservative Catholic circles, Castillo is labeled a “cultural traitor,” accused of exploiting pain for ideological gain. Right-wing politicians in El Salvador and Guatemala have dismissed her as a “foreign-funded radical,” leveraging anti-imperialist sentiment to discredit her. These dangers reflect a systemic effort to control narratives, particularly around corruption, violence, and institutional complicity. Yet Castillo

remains undeterred. She describes her work as a form of “moral archaeology,” unearthing layers of silence to expose what has been buried. “If a community stops speaking,” she writes, “it is not because it has forgotten God—it has forgotten how to listen—to itself, to its ancestors, to its own pain.”

Global Comparisons: Echoes Beyond Latin America
