In San Lima, protests erupted not just over his death, but as a broader expression of discontent with perceived institutional failure. Religious leaders, civil activists, and even political opposition figures converged in public mourning, framing his passing as a symptom of systemic decay. This convergence underscored a deeper truth: in an age of disinformation and declining trust, religious institutions no longer operate in isolation. They are nodes in a complex network of cultural, political, and economic forces—and their collapse or renewal carries cascading consequences.

Forward-looking projections suggest that Vásquez's era may yet shape decades of ecclesial evolution. His emphasis on transparency, community accountability, and prophetic witness has already inspired a new generation of clergy and lay leaders. Pilot programs in financial openness and participatory governance, initiated under his leadership, are being studied by reform coalitions across the continent. Yet the path ahead is fraught. The Church's ability to adapt without fracturing depends on balancing continuity with innovation—a task complicated by competing visions of faith, power, and truth.
