This figure, neither saint nor hero, is a vessel of collective memory, carrying the weight of displacement, faith, and cultural survival. To examine the pilgrim in **Evangeline** is to traverse the layered intersections of 19th-century North American geopolitics, the transatlantic literary boom, and the long shadow of colonial displacement. His pilgrimage is not merely spiritual but deeply political—a cartography of loss that speaks to Indigenous dispossession, Acadian exile, and the quiet resistance of marginalized identities. Longfellow wrote **Evangeline** during a period of profound transformation in the United States. The pilgrim of **Evangeline** is a literary continuation of this rupture—a spectral wanderer tracing the ghostly contours of what was lost. Longfellow's portrayal is not based on firsthand

testimony but on a synthesis of oral histories, colonial records, and the Romantic tradition's fascination with the tragic exile. Yet his genius lies in transforming a collective trauma into a personal odyssey. Evangeline, the pilgrim's companion and voice, becomes the emotional nucleus—her grief layered with spiritual yearning, but also sharp-eyed in her critique. She does not merely mourn; she questions, resists, and asserts dignity amid subjugation. This duality—vulnerable yet defiant—elevates the pilgrim from symbol to subject, from archetype to agent of memory. The evolution of the pilgrim archetype in **Evangeline** reflects broader currents in 19th-century literature and thought. Romanticism's emphasis on emotion, individual experience, and the sublime
