Its emergence and evolution reflect not only pedagogical innovation but also deeper contestations over who controls knowledge, how it is measured, and for whom. This is not merely a form used by schools; it is a barometer of societal priorities, a mechanism of standardization, and a contested site where data, power, and identity converge. The origins of the Free Alphabet Assessment Sheet are rooted in

the mid-20th century expansion of international literacy campaigns, particularly in post-colonial states and developing economies.
