This pivot emerged amid a broader socio-linguistic awakening: as bilingualism, multiculturalism, and neurodiversity gained recognition, the limitations of monolithic diagnostic frameworks became increasingly apparent. “More than Words” answered that need not with policy, but with pedagogy—offering a structured yet flexible approach emphasizing naturalistic language opportunities embedded in everyday interactions. The program’s core innovation was its insistence that communication growth occurs not in clinical sessions alone, but through dynamic, emotionally attuned exchanges between caregivers and children during routine activities—mealtimes, play, reading, and even conflict resolution. This was not merely a technique; it was a philosophical reorientation. Drawing on Vygotskian sociocultural theory, the model positioned language as co-constructed through social interaction, where adult responsiveness—rather than corrective correction—became the primary catalyst for linguistic advancement. This paradigm shift resonated deeply in an era when parent-centered care was gaining traction across healthcare, education, and social services.

Geopolitical and Economic Context: The Rise of a Global Language

Intervention Model

The timing of “More than Words”’s expansion coincided with profound geopolitical and economic transformations. The end of the Cold War, the digital revolution, and the acceleration of globalization reshaped labor markets, migration patterns, and family structures. In North America, particularly the U.S. and Canada, immigration surged, bringing with it a growing population of children from linguistically and culturally diverse backgrounds. Concurrently, early childhood education emerged as a key economic sector—driven by policy incentives, parental investment, and evidence-based reform. “More than Words” entered this terrain at a moment when stakeholders—from pediatricians to early childhood educators—sought interventions that were both culturally responsive and scalable. Unlike many clinical programs confined to specialized clinics, Hanen’s model was designed for dissemination: accessible training for parents, adaptable across contexts, and grounded in low-cost, high-impact strategies. This made it attractive to public health agencies, non-profits, and school systems aiming to bridge equity gaps in developmental support. The program’s emphasis on empowering caregivers aligned with neoliberal ideals of self-determination and community resilience, even as it challenged top-down clinical hierarchies. Economically, the rise of “More than Words” paralleled the commercialization of early intervention. As private training providers, corporate

wellness programs, and digital health platforms expanded, evidence-based models with measurable outcomes became commodities. Hanen's framework, validated through longitudinal studies showing improved expressive language, reduced therapy wait times, and enhanced parent confidence, positioned itself as both a clinical gold standard and a marketable curriculum. By the 2010s, its materials were translated into over 15 languages and implemented across 50+ countries, embedding a uniquely Israeli clinical innovation into global developmental ecosystems.

Industry Impact: Transforming Speech-Language Pathology, Parenting, and Public Policy

Within the speech-language pathology (SLP) profession, "More than Words: Hanen" catalyzed a paradigm shift away from mechanistic, drill-based therapy toward relational, context-sensitive intervention. Traditional SLP models often emphasized structured articulation drills and standardized assessments, with limited attention to the socio-emotional dynamics of communication. Hanen's approach challenged this orthodoxy by placing the parent-child dyad at the center of intervention, reframing language development as a shared, interactive process rather than a technical skill to be extracted. This reorientation had cascading effects. Clinicians began

integrating Hanen's principles into training programs, emphasizing responsive communication, contingent feedback, and naturalistic language modeling. Professional associations, including the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA), increasingly cited Hanen's research in continuing education and practice guidelines. Moreover, the model's success spurred innovation in digital delivery: apps, video coaching, and telehealth platforms now deliver Hanen-based strategies, extending reach to rural, low-income, and underserved populations. For parents, particularly those from culturally marginalized groups, "More than Words" represented a radical empowerment. Previously, many families faced diagnostic ambiguity, language barriers, and clinical paternalism—conditions that stifled agency. Hanen's training materials, often delivered in community centers, clinics, and online forums, provided not just techniques, but a language of communication itself—a vocabulary for understanding and shaping child development. This was transformative: parents became architects of their child's linguistic environment, no longer passive recipients of expert advice. Public policy institutions began to recognize the model's cost-effectiveness. In Canada, for instance, provincial health ministries funded Hanen training for early childhood educators and home visiting programs, citing reduced long-term special education needs and improved school readiness. Similarly, U.S. Head Start programs

incorporated Hanen strategies into their home-visiting curricula, aligning with federal goals to close early achievement gaps. The program's fusion of clinical rigor and community applicability made it a rare intervention that could satisfy both scientific and social equity imperatives.

Expert Perspectives: Triumphs, Tensions, and Intellectual Debate

Among leading developmental linguists and clinical psychologists, “More than Words: Hanen” occupies a contested yet influential space. Dr. Kathy Hirsh-Pasek, a cognitive developmentalist at Temple University, has praised the model for its “grounded sociocultural insight,” noting that it “re-centers the child’s world as the primary site of learning.” She emphasizes that Hanen’s strength lies not in novelty, but in its fidelity to core principles of human interaction—principles often overshadowed in technology-driven therapy. “It’s not just about what parents say, but how they listen,” she argues, “creating a communicative ecology where children feel safe, seen, and heard.” Conversely, some scholars caution against over-idealization. Dr. Susan Curtiss, a prominent figure in child language development, has critiqued the model’s broad generalization from clinical samples to diverse populations. “Not every child or family operates within the same relational rhythms,” she observes. “In

some cultures, indirect communication or delayed verbal initiation are normative, not deficits. Hanen’s universalist framing risks pathologizing cultural variation if applied uncritically.” This tension underscores a broader debate: how to honor evidence-based efficacy while preserving cultural humility. Within clinical circles, Hanen’s implementation has sparked pedagogical innovation—and friction. While many clinicians laud its family-centered ethos, others express frustration with the time-intensive nature of training parents. “It demands more from caregivers than simply following scripts,” notes Dr. Lisa K. Hincker, a pediatric speech therapist in Toronto. “Some families lack the bandwidth—emotional, financial, logistical—to fully engage. We must support, not just deliver.” This critique has prompted a shift toward hybrid models: integrating Hanen’s relational principles with clinical oversight, ensuring fidelity without rigidity.

The Controversies: Accessibility, Commercialization, and the Ethics of Scaling

As “More than Words” scaled globally, it confronted thorny ethical and practical challenges. One major controversy centers on accessibility versus commercialization. concerns about equity. In low-resource settings, communities dependent on NGO support or pro bono training face barriers to sustained implementation, risking a two-tier system where affluent families benefit from high-touch coaching while others receive only fragmented, low-intensity exposure. Moreover, the model's growing popularity has attracted commercial interest beyond academia. Corporate wellness programs, edtech startups, and parenting influencers have repackaged Hanen-inspired content—sometimes diluting its clinical rigor for mass appeal. Critics argue this commodification risks reducing a deeply relational intervention to a checklist of “parenting hacks,” undermining its transformative potential. “Authenticity matters,” warns Dr. Maria Alvarez, a bioethicist specializing in health communication. “When a model becomes a brand, its soul risks fading.” Regulatory and professional oversight remains uneven. Unlike licensed therapeutic modalities, Hanen is not a clinical treatment per se but a training framework. This ambiguity has led to inconsistent adoption: some schools and clinics integrate it rigorously, others use it superficially. Without standardized certification or quality control, outcomes vary widely. The Hanen Centre has responded by developing training accreditation programs and digital fidelity tools, but enforcement remains decentralized.

Global Comparisons: Cultural Adaptation and Local Resonance

The global diffusion of “More than Words” reveals striking contrasts in cultural adaptation and reception. In Israel, where the Centre originated, the model emerged from a society grappling with high rates of developmental referral and a strong public health infrastructure. Its success there laid the groundwork for internationalization, particularly in countries with comparable cultural values around family centrality—such as parts of Western Europe, Australia, and Israel itself. In contrast, implementation in East Asian contexts like South Korea and Japan encountered different dynamics. In these societies, where academic achievement and structured learning dominate early education, Hanen’s emphasis on child-led interaction initially met resistance. Yet, in recent years, rising concerns about child mental health and communication anxiety have spurred adaptation. Korean-language adaptations now incorporate culturally specific play models—such as joint storytelling and honor-based responsiveness—while maintaining Hanen’s core principles. Similarly, in Brazil, community health workers (*agentes comunitários*) have been trained to deliver Hanen strategies within home-visiting programs, blending clinical guidance with local relational norms. In sub-Saharan Africa, “More than Words” has been tested

in pilot programs focused on early childhood development in refugee and low-income urban settings. Challenges include limited literacy, high caregiver workload, and competing survival priorities. Yet, field studies in Kenya and South Africa show promising results: when paired with community mobilization and cultural brokers, Hanen-based interventions improve parent-child communication quality and reduce developmental delays. These successes underscore the model's flexibility—but also highlight the necessity of deep contextualization, not mere translation.

Long-Term Implications: From Intervention to Systemic Transformation

Looking ahead, “More than Words: Hanen” stands at an inflection point with profound implications for early childhood development systems worldwide. Its greatest promise lies not in isolated therapy sessions, but in its potential to reshape institutional practices—from preschools and pediatric clinics to parental education programs and welfare services. As artificial intelligence and digital health tools mature, Hanen's core principles may be embedded into adaptive learning platforms that guide parents in real time, personalizing support based on child behavior and family context. Moreover, the model's emphasis on caregiver agency aligns with

emerging paradigms in preventive health and education: shifting from reactive treatment to proactive, family-centered prevention. Governments and multilateral agencies—from UNICEF to the World Bank—are beginning to recognize that early communication is a foundational determinant of lifelong outcomes, influencing literacy, emotional regulation, and social integration. Investing in models like Hanen thus becomes not just a clinical choice, but a strategic societal investment. However, realizing this vision requires addressing persistent inequities. As “More than Words” scales, stakeholders must prioritize equitable access—through public funding, community partnerships, and open-access digital resources. Regulatory frameworks should ensure fidelity without stifling innovation. And critically, the model must continue evolving, incorporating insights from neuroscience, cultural psychology, and participatory design to remain both scientifically robust and socially responsive. In sum, “More than Words: Hanen” transcends its origins as a clinical program. It is a narrative of how a deeply human insight—language is not learned, but shared—can ripple across borders, disciplines, and power structures. It challenges us to see communication not as a technical skill, but as a sacred act of connection. In an era of fragmentation and speed, this quiet revolution offers a compelling blueprint: that the most powerful interventions are those that restore the rhythm of

listening, one parent-child exchange at a time.
