NavPurs 1616/25’s annexes included clauses mandating crew certification under international safety and welfare codes, indirectly pressuring flag states to upgrade training infrastructure. Yet critics warned of a “two-tier” crew market: vessels compliant with NavPurs could attract higher-skilled personnel and better retention, while others faced labor shortages and declining competitiveness. Environmental considerations added further complexity. While NavPurs prioritized efficiency, it did not mandate decarbonization—though participating states were encouraged to adopt IMO’s GHG reduction targets. A growing number of green shipping corridors aligned with NavPurs priorities, creating a convergence of economic and environmental incentives. Geopolitical Dimensions: Sovereignty, Security, and Strategic Control

Experts emphasize that NavPurs 1616/25 does not constitute a treaty but

functions as a normative architecture—one that complements and sometimes supersedes existing international law. Its strength lies in its adaptability: participating states negotiate annexes tailored to regional needs, allowing for differentiated access without rigid uniformity. Environmental groups have expressed concern that NavPurs's focus on efficiency may incentivize speed over sustainability. While some priority lanes mandate low-emission corridors, others prioritize speed, potentially encouraging older, less-efficient vessels to seek fast-track access despite higher carbon footprints. The International Maritime Organization's own emissions reduction targets, though robust, are not uniformly enforced across NavPurs jurisdictions, creating a regulatory gray zone.
