From a cybersecurity standpoint, the increasing connectivity of modern controllers—enabling over-the-air updates and GPS tracking—introduces vulnerabilities. A compromised controller could allow unauthorized speed manipulation or data exfiltration. The EU’s upcoming Cyber Resilience Act (CRA) will mandate secure boot and firmware integrity checks for such devices, forcing manufacturers to embed cryptographic safeguards within the wiring and control logic.

Global Comparisons: Divergent Paths to Standardization

While the 24V 4-phase controller dominates in Europe and East Asia, regional variations reveal alternative trajectories. In North America, adoption has been slower due to entrenched 36V high-voltage e-bike norms and regulatory fragmentation.
