Its origins trace back to the late 20th century, a period marked by escalating construction failures, escalating costs, and a growing recognition that the fragmented, often informal training of site

supervisors was inadequate for managing megaprojects. In the United States, the International Construction Management Association (ICMA), founded in 1971, began laying foundational standards for professional practice, but formal certification remained ad hoc. The first structured study guides for certified construction managers emerged in the early 1990s, driven by a convergence: rising urbanization, especially in emerging economies; increasing reliance on project-based delivery models; and a demand from governments and developers for verifiable expertise.
