The industry response has been mixed. On one hand, adaptive learning platforms now use natural language processing (NLP) to generate context clues tailored to student demographics—adjusting vocabulary, cultural references, and sentence structure in real time. Companies like Lexia and Amplify offer “culturally responsive” worksheets that incorporate diverse characters, settings, and experiences, aiming to increase relevance and reduce bias.
