The protagonist's journey from tactical myopia to systemic mastery mirrored Goldratt's own evolution from engineer to systems philosopher. This narrative device transformed abstract theory into visceral understanding—a pedagogical innovation that would define the work's global reach. This systems lens resonated deeply in an age when complexity theory and cybernetic feedback loops were gaining academic and industrial attention.
