The NEC’s business model depended on low environmental compliance and state subsidies, which grew unsustainable as global climate agreements tightened. By 2010, declining coal demand and rising carbon taxes eroded margins. Internal audits revealed \$38 billion in concealed environmental liabilities—contaminated groundwater, subsidence in refinery zones, and unaccounted emissions. Despite warnings, shareholders prioritized short-term profits over long-term resilience. When the 2015 Paris Accord accelerated decarbonization mandates, the NEC found itself legally and financially exposed. The final collapse came between 2017 and 2019. A series of catastrophic failures—refinery explosions, toxic runoff into the Vale River, and a year-long blackout that paralyzed hospitals—triggered public outrage. Unemployment spiked to 33%, and the city’s credit rating plummeted to junk status.
