In the 1960s, a family gathering around the TV set to consult the evening schedule was a ritual of shared cultural rhythm. Today, that ritual has splintered across platforms—YouTube, apps, personalized streaming recommendations—each driven by opaque algorithms that prioritize engagement over local context. For local stations, this shift has imposed existential risks. KSTP (Channel 5), once a regional powerhouse, now competes not only with national networks but with national behemoths like ESPN, Fox News, and Netflix. Its on-air guide lists have shrunk, replaced by digital feeds that push personalized content, often sidelining local news and community programming. Even St. Louis Public Television (STLTV), a vital source of educational and cultural content, struggles with funding and audience reach, its listings now secondary to digital streaming platforms.
