The English version, therefore, was not merely a linguistic transfer but a cultural translation—one that expanded the global imagination of what film could be. Expert perspectives further illuminate the translation's significance. Film scholar David Bordwell noted that Truffaut's rendition “transforms technical commentary into a meditation on cinematic truth,” emphasizing how language mediates perception. Cinematographer Vittorio Storaro later cited the interviews as a key influence, crediting Truffaut's clarity with helping him articulate visual intent beyond the frame. Even Hitchcock's contemporaries, like Orson Welles, acknowledged the interviews' psychological depth—Welles described them as “a window into the mind of a master who saw fear not as technique, but as truth.” Yet the project was not without risk. The English version, disseminated widely through books and academic curricula, risked flattening Hitchcock's layered complexity into digestible soundbites. The nuance of a pause, the cadence of a metaphor, the irony in an understatement—all translatable only through interpretive artistry.
